



Ohio Academic Content Standards

Kindergarten: RF.K, L.K.1

Things you will need:

- Yarn or string
- Paper
- Pencil, marker or crayon
- Clothes pins or tape



Extension:

If you have set up the DIY laser maze in your house, this is a great extension to help your kiddos with their letters!

With the tangled web of strings in place, clip letters onto the strings with clothespins (or tape). Letters could be quickly written on a piece of paper, or if you have any letters from puzzles or foam pieces, these can work just as well. Letters are best placed in a random order, so kids have to actively look for the correct one, and if you have multiple kids working together, it might be good to have multiple sets of letters as well. If you want to make it a learning activity for lowercase and uppercase letters, choose either upper case or lower case to place into the laser field.

Call out different letters, and have your kids climb through the maze to find each letter. If you have younger kiddos who are not quite ready for the alphabet, you can also do a spy game that just focuses on grabbing pom poms (or any other colorful materials) from the tangled web.
